



'Timber' at Beales Hotel!

Beales Hotel in Hatfield has been the scene of giant tree felling this Autumn. An enormous poplar tree that has towered over the hotel for many years was found to be diseased and therefore unsafe, so expert tree surgeons were called in.

"It is always a shame to have to remove such an old tree but the experts said it was the only option. As we are celebrating our 50th Anniversary this year we have decided to plant a new tree at a special ceremony in November," said Beales Hotels Managing Director Andrew Beale.

The new tree will be a Giant Redwood, grown from seed at the company's sister hotel West Lodge Park in Enfield, where they have an award winning arboretum.

Originally called Hatfield Lodge, Beales Hotel was purchased by the Beale family business fifty years ago in 1964 and has since been developed into the highest rated four-star hotel in the county.
